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Being a social scientist and a member of the Dalit community in India, he has researched on marginalisation process of development initiatives, and published papers and monographs detailing the socioeconomic implications of economic change in the past and the contemporary. He has independently conducted many research projects and the undergoing one is titled as 'Self-Help Groups in Kerala: A Study in Economic Sociology' funded by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi. He has numerous writings in his mother tongue-Malayalam including books and articles.
